Beverly B. "Duck" Durbin, age 77, of 654 Franklin Street, passed away in his residence Thursday morning. He was born in Pryse, Kentucky, the son of Curtis and Anis (McQueen) Durbin. He was a member of St. Peter Catholic Church. He is a veteran of World War II with the United States Army from 1939-1945. He is a member of Moose 36, Eagles 409, K of C 968, American Legion 138, VFW 1069 and UAW Local 233. He was employed as a tow motor operator for Fisher Body for 23 years, retiring in 1974. In 1942 in Ervin, Kentucky, he was married to Laura Miller and she preceded him in death in 1986.

He is survived by two sons, Linus Durbin, of Toledo, Ohio and James Durbin, of Hamilton; by one daughter, Mrs. David (Judy Ann) Trimble, of Chillicothe, Ohio; one brother, Silas Durbin, of Fullston, North Carolina; and seven grandchildren.
