Gano Woolums Taken By Death

Gano Woolums, 73, 326 S. Seventh St., died at 2:30 a. m. Saturday following a heart attack in his home.

Born in Clark County, Ky., on Dec. 4, 1884, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Woolums, he was educated in public schools in that area and came to Hamilton many years ago. Before his retirement, he was employed for eight years at the Baldwin - Lima - Hamilton Corp.
