## Bernhardt Brungs, Streetcar Conductor

Bernhardt J. Brungs, 83, of 1714 Holman street, Covington, died at 7:40 a.m. Thursday at St. Elizabeth Hospital, where he had been a patient five days. He had been ill a long time.

Mr. Brungs—affectionally called "High Pockets" by his friends—was a streetcar conductor and motorman for the Green Line for 46 years. He retired some years ago.

He was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Holy Name Society of the Cathedral Ba-

silica of the Assumption, Covington.

He was a former member of Bishop Carrell Council, Knights of Columbus, and of Bishop Flaget Assembly Fourth Degree Knights.

Survivors include a sister, Miss Helen Brungs, Covington, and two brothers, Paul, of Cincinnati, and William Brungs, of Columbus, O.
