## MRS. CHARLES HAYES, FORMER CITY COUNCI **CLERK, PASSES AWAY**

Motherhood Proved Fatal to Beloved Woman-Rites Here Monday

Mrs. Clarissa Pater Hayer, wife of Charles Hayes, died at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Cincinnati Friday at 2:20 p. m. following the birth of a son on Sunday.

Death again claimed one of Hamilton's loveliest young women yesterday afternoon, when Mrs. Hayes passed away. Everything in the way of science and medical aid was done but to no avail—Mrs. Hayes was called to give up her life for another.
