MRS. CHARLES HAYES, FORMER CITY COUNCIL CLERK, PASSES AWAY

Motherhood Proved Fatal
to Beloved Woman—
Rites Here Monday

Mrs. Clarissa Pater Hayes, wife of Charles Hayes, died at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Cincinnati Friday at 2:20 p. m. following the birth of a son on Sunday.

Death again claimed one of Hamilton's loveliest young women yesterday afternoon, when Mrs. Hayes passed away. Everything in the way of science and medical aid was done but to no avail—Mrs. Hayes was called to give up her life for another.

Mrs. Hayes was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clem Pater. She was born here on September 30, 1900, and spent her entire life here until her marriage on November 10, 1926, when the young couple established their home in Chicago.

Mrs. Hayes came here four weeks ago. She was a patient sufferer and the care and anxiety of loved ones proved to be helpless against the call of death.

She attended the St. Joseph's Catholic school and was graduated from the Notre Dame Academy in 1918 and was also an active member of the alumnae association of that school. She was a charter member of the Daughters of Isabella and was the first secretary of that society, always taking an active part in its work.

Surviving her are: the bereaved husband, the little son, Charles Jr., her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clem Pater, three brothers, Raymond C. Pater, B. Vincent Pater and Clement A. Pater and one sister, Miss Cecelia Pater.

Besides the immediate family she also leaves a large number of relatives and a host of friends drawn to her by her attractive personality and her beautiful character. After her graduation from Notre Dame Academy she was the efficient clerk of the Hamilton city council.

Funeral services will take place Monday at 8:30 a. m., from the home of the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clem Pater, 507 South Second street, and from St. Joseph's Catholic church at 9 a. m. Interment will be made in St. Stephen's cemetery. Friends may call after Sunday noon.

For the requiem high mass Rev. Joseph Collins, a relative of Mrs. Hayes will be celebrant; Rev. George Mayerhoefer is to be deacon and Rev. John Mayerhoefer, sub-deacon.
