During the Depression Mrs. Powers had to give up a scholarship and take a job to help support her family. Later, she worked to put her own children through college.

"Her family meant everything to her," said a daughter, Mary Ann Powers-Tcheng of Raleigh-Durham, N. C.

Mrs. Powers, 77, of Ft. Mitchell,

died at 12:40 a.m. Wednesday at Jewish Hospital in Cincinnati.

She was a retired secretary for First National Bank in Cincinnati, which is now Star Bank.

Mrs. Powers enjoyed gardening. She also loved socializing with her friends.

She enjoyed bingo and playing bridge. She was a member of Baker-Hunt Club in Covington and Blessed Sacrament Church in Ft. Mitchell, where she was a

member of the 55+ Club.

Mrs. Powers-Tcheng said her mother believed in education and instilled that in her children.

"She said if you had an education you can do anything -- no body can take that away from you."

Besides her daughter, other survivors include her husband of 45 years, John W. Powers; another daughter, Susan Lehn of Hillsboro, Ohio, a sister, Gene-

vieve Carbery of Naples, Fla., and three grandchildren.
