Milk Truck Turns Over; Driver Safe

Robert Bornhorn, 1819 Jefferson avenue, Covington, escaped injury and being trapped in a French-Bauer milk truck early Monday when the truck rolled onto its side and caught fire after a rear wheel came off.

It was first believed the driver had been trapped in the truck and two squads of police were rushed to the Newport end of the Veterans Memorial Bridge, the scene of the mishap.

The driver, however, had made his escape. Firemen were summoned to extinguish the blaze. Loss was slight.
