## JOHN RIEGLER STROKE VICTIM

Former Kenton County Deputy  
Sheriff Dies After At-  
tack; Rites Set

Requiem high mass for John Riegler, former Kenton county deputy sheriff, who died Saturday at St. Elizabeth Hospital after suffering a stroke of apoplexy, will be sung Wednesday at 9 a. m. at St. Henry Church, Erlanger. Burial will be in St. John Cemetery, Covington.

Coroner James P. Riffe said he was told an unidentified man brought Mr. Riegler to the hospital, but that he was unable to learn where Mr. Riegler had suffered the stroke. He died 15 minutes after admittance to the hospital.

Mr. Riegler was 53 years old. He retired two months ago after operating a cafe in Erlanger. He served as deputy sheriff for 12 years under Sheriffs Harry G. Klosterman and John Besterman. He lived at 73 Forest avenue, Erlanger.

He leaves his widow, Mrs. Clara Riegler, and four sons, Hilary, John Jr., Louis and George.

The body is at the Linnemann funeral home, 25 East Eleventh street, Covington.
