Robert Wright, Navy man, butcher

Chief Petty Officer Robert Joseph Wright, 60, of Wayskin Drive in Covington, died at 6:30 p.m. Saturday at home.

He was a World War II Navy veteran, serving as a commissary chief. He served a total of 29 years in the Navy, six on active duty, and eventually rose to the rank of chief petty officer, the highest rank below that of officer.

In civilian life, Wright worked for the Kroger Co. for 30 years. He was head meat cutter

for the Greater Cincinnati area, and worked in many stores throughout Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

He also was a member of the Oak Ridge Volunteer Fire Department, and of St. Patrick Church in Independence.

Survivors include his wife, Louella Burroughs Wright; daughters, Shawna Bromwell of Marietta, Ga., and Kay Lynn Kinsler of Burlington; sons, Stephen P. Wright of Louisville, Mark D. Wright of Burlington, and Scott D. Wright, at home;

his mother, Marie Wright of Latonia; a brother, Jack Wright of Villa Hills; and eight grandchildren.

Mass of Christian burial with military honors will be at 11 a.m. tomorrow at St. Patrick Church in Independence. Visitation will be from 4 to 9 tonight at Connely Brothers Funeral Home in Latonia.
