

## SP4 David Roberts Dies In Vietnam War

United States Army SP4 David Owen Roberts, 19 years old, a George Washington High School graduate, has been killed in action in South Vietnam.

SP4 Roberts, son of Mr. and Mrs. Caradoc Roberts, 1235 Kappes Street, was the 503d Hoosier to die in the Vietnam War.

notified the parents he was killed during a mortar attack Jan. 31 on his company's position near Hue, Vietnam. He was assigned to Headquarters Company, First Battalion, Fifth Cavalry.

HE WAS A MEMBER of the Speedway Methodist Church.


