Edward H. Kampsen, 70, grocer

Edward H. Kampsen, 70, suffered an apparent heart attack about 9:15 p.m. Monday while driving home from his grocery at 34th and Graff streets, Covington.

The Covington Life Squad took Mr. Kampsen to St. Elizabeth Hospital where he died a short time later. He lived at 333 E. 33d street, Latonia.

MR. KAMPSEN, former leader of his own orchestra, had operated the store about 20 years.
