## Leo G. Kampsen, Catholic educator

Rev. Leo G. Kampsen, 69, professor of education at St. Pius Seminary and an active diocesan educator many years, died at 3:50 p.m. Monday at St. Elizabeth Hospital.

Father Kampsen, who suffered a heart ailment and circulatory trouble, had been in the hospital since Feb. 22.

BORN IN Covington, he attended St. Augustine School, Covington; Abbey School, Richardson, N. D.; St. Mary College in Kentucky, and St. Gregory and Mt. St. Mary Seminaries in Ohio.

He was ordained a priest May 30, 1932, at the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption.

FATHER KAMPSEN served as assistant pastor at Corpus Christi, the Cathedral, St. Bernard and St. Thomas parishes in northern Kentucky.

Then he was named headmaster of Lexington Catholic High School, where he served a number of years. He also was chaplain of the Federal Narcotics Hospital at Lexington.

During service as chaplain at Cardome Visitation Convent, Georgetown, he also was chaplain of a prisoner-of-war camp at Avon, Ky.

FATHER KAMPSEN RETURNED to northern Kentucky as chaplain of St. Walburg convent in 1968 and was named dean of studies and a member of the committee on admissions at St. Pius Seminary. He became professor of education in 1970.

He also was a member of the Diocesan Department of Education committee on certification and accreditation.

He held Bachelor of Arts, Master of Arts and Master of Education degrees.

SURVIVORS INCLUDE three brothers, Lt. Col. Ralph Kampsen, assistant Covington police chief; Earl, member of the Covington Housing Authority, and Eugene, Seattle, Wash.

Also three sisters, Mrs. Ruth Covington, Mrs. Josephine Toebbe and Mrs. Esther Bell, all of Covington.

Transfer of the body will be 4 p.m. Wednesday from Henry Linnemann Sons Funeral Home, Covington, to the Cathedral.

Office of the Dead will be at 10 a.m. Thursday, with a Concelebrated Mass of the Resurrection at 10:30 a.m. Bishop Richard H. Ackerman of Covington will be principal concelebrant.

Burial will be in the priests' cemetery at St. Pius Seminary.
