## Baker Klosterman, 70, loses fight for life

Bakery executive Bernard Frank Klosterman lost his courageous twomonth fight for life at 4 a.m. Sunday.

'He was a hell of a fighter,' said Klosterman's son, Kenneth, president of Klosterman's Baking Co.

— Klosterman, ₹0, was admitted to St. Elizabeth Hospital in June after suffering a-heart attack.

"His heart stopped twice on him he had meningitis and they had him in ice blankers for three days," said his son. "But he was getting ready to come home in two weeks."

Klosterman, of 23 Leathers Rd., Pt. Mitchell, was graduated from Holmes High School and Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pa., where he majored in business administration.

He was a basketball star in high

He was a basketball star in high school and college and went on to play running guard for the Cincinnati Wildcats professional team in 1929.

He joined the family baking company. in 1932 and worked in sales and production before becoming a partner in the late 1930's. He was president of the company for about 10 years before becoming chairman of the board five years ago.

"He was a great bread eater, but never was a 'baker,'" said Kenneth Klosterman.

Klösterman was past president of the Ohio Baker's Assn., Retail Bakers of America and TriState Baker's Assn. He belonged to the American Bakers Assn. He was second president of Summit Hills Country Club and served about nine years. He was a member of the Cincinnati Club, Covington Elks Lodge, Knights of Columbus Council 702, and Blessed Sacrament Church,

His wife, Emmalyn, died in 1972. Other survivors include three grandchildren.
