Rites Thursday for Former Corn King, 79

A former world corn king, Edward N. Lux. 79, R. R. 1, Waldron, Shelby Township, died Sunday at 11 45 am, at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis, where he had been a patient two weeks. He had been in failing health for 14 years and death was due to cancer.

Mr. Lux was a retired farmer and hybrid seed corn grower and was international Corn King in 1931 He also was named twice as fadiana Corn King.

He was a member of St. Vincent Catholic Church and served as grand knight of Council 822. Knights of Columbus, in 1924-25. He formerly was a director of the Federal Land Bank.

Mr. Lux was born in Shelby County Aug. 2, 1889, the son of John and Elizabeth (Schaf) Lux. On April 27, 1999, he married Henrietta Leiland, who died April 25, 1929.
