

Mullen, Jordan Monroe 1843 - 1918

MULLEN.

Mr. J. M. Mullen, in his 76th year, a well known retired farmer, died of Bright's disease at his home in Belmont, Monday at 6 a. m., after about four years' illness.

He was born in this county on May 5, 1843. His first wife, formerly Bettie Turner, died 43 years ago. His second wife, formerly Miss Kittie A. Whalen, survives. The surviving children by his first wife are Messrs Richard, James, Ezekiel and Albert Mullen; those by his second marriage are Mrs. Jas. Kearns, Mrs. Sanford Hill, Mrs. Joe Lee Johnson, Mrs. Shirley Anderson, Mrs. William Elliott, Messrs. Joseph and Henry Mullen. He leaves also one brother, Mr. George Mullen, and one sister, Mrs. Sarah E. Devers.

Mr. Mullen was a member of the Curry Methodist Church. He spent most of his life on a farm, moving to town about four years ago.

The funeral services, conducted by Rev. Byrd, of Winchester, were held at the grave in Jacksonville Cemetery Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Four sons by the first wife survive, Richard, James, Ezekiel and Albert Mullen; five daughters and two sons by the second wife: Mrs. James Kearns, Mrs. Sanford Hill, Mrs. Joe Lee Johnson, Mrs. Shirley Anderson, Mrs. Wm. Elliott, Joe and Henry Mullen. He is survived also by a brother and sister, George Mullen, and Mrs. Sarah E. Devers. Mr. Mullen was a retired farmer, having removed to Cynthiana from the county four years ago. He was a member of the Curry Methodist church. The burial took place in the Jacksonville cemetery yesterday afternoon, with services at the grave by Rev. Byrd, of Winchester.
