Funeral services for Orié Thomas (Tommy) Mullen of 400 Wilson Ave., Cynthiana, were conducted Saturday afternoon at Smith-Rees Chapel by Rev. Earl Curry.

Mr. Mullen, 39, died suddenly at 4:30 p.m. May 9, at Harrison Memorial Hospital. He was employed at Farmers Fuel Gas Company and was a Volunteer Fireman.

Born April 16, 1924, in Harrison County, he was a son of Atwell Mullen of Cynthiana and Mrs. Anna Mary Hollar of Lexington. He was a member of the First Methodist Church and was a veteran of World War II. He was a member of the Imperial Encampment, No. 68 of Paris, and the Cynthiana Lodge No. 127 IOOF where he served as Noble Grand.
