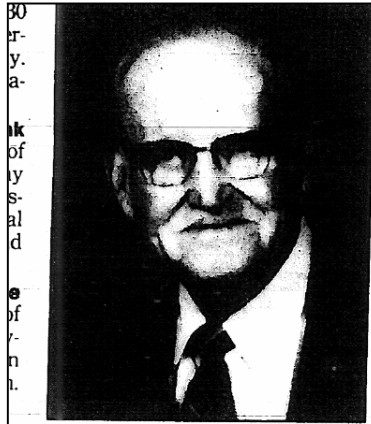


Lexington Herald Leader – December 14, 1992



Marshall "Buck" Burns, 81, husband of Edna Lee Ransdell Hipshire Burns, died Sun. at St. Joseph Hosp.
