OBITUARY.

Funeral Announcements of Deceased Citizens.

Robert S. Ransdell, a most respected citizen of Paris, who has been in ill health for the past two years, died Sunday morning at eleven o'clock, aged sixty four years. The deceased was born near Centerville, and was an industrious business man, an exemplary citizen, a kind father, a devoted husband, and a friend esteemed by all who knew him. He was a member of the firm of Sidener & Ransdell, who had the contract for the brick work on the court house, J. E. Clay's residence and many other buildings. He bore his sufferings with Christian fortitude and did not fear death, his only thoughts being for the welfare of the loved ones he was leaving behind. The deceased is survived by his wife, and step-son—Robert S. Porter—to whom the sympathy of a legion of friends is extended. The funeral will take place from the residence this morning at half-past ten, with services at the grave by Eld. J. T. Sharrard. The pall-bearers will be W. A. Parker, Sr., A. J. Fee, J. T. Quisenberry, George R. Bell, P. I. McCarthy, John N. Davis, Wm. Rion, George Minter.

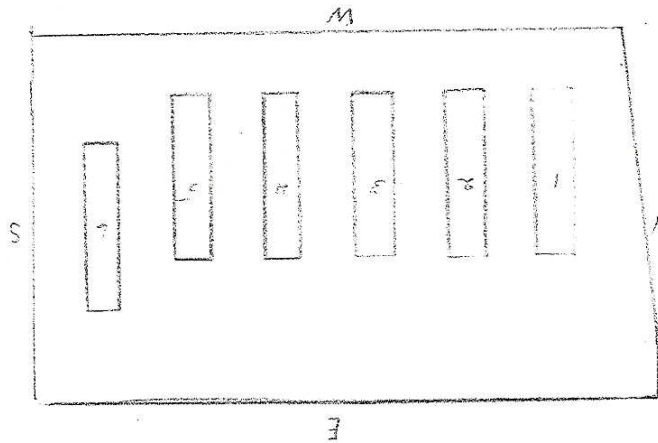
