COVINGTON AUTO VICTIM IS DEAD

Mrs. Anna Franxman Succumbs at Ohio Hospital Following Collision

Mrs. Anna Franxman, 62, of 1338 Garrard-st., Covington, died late yesterday at a ~~D. S. O.~~ ~~Ohio~~ hospital as a result of injuries suffered Thursday when an auto in which she was a passenger collided with another auto on the Delaware-Cleveland pike, four miles south of Delaware.

Her son, William Franxman, 27, driver of the auto, and her daughter, Vera Mae, escaped injury.

According to dispatches, the Franxman auto was sideswiped by an auto driven by F. R. Williams, Cleveland. The Franxman auto overturned following the collision. Mrs. Franxman suffered a skull fracture and chest injuries.

Besides her son and daughter, she leaves her husband, William Franxman Sr., another son, Edwin Franxman, and one sister, Mrs. Fanny Meyer.
